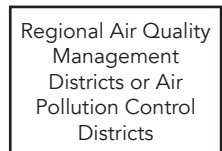

In addition, oil & gas producers must obtain encroachment permits from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, California Department of Transportation and California Department of Water Resources depending on the location of activities.

Finally, oil & gas producers are typically also regulated by city or county Building & Safety, Environmental, Fire, Planning and Public Works Departments, and by special districts that provide water supply, sanitation, fire protection, utilities or other services.
